### **Introduction:**

The Project deals with the question of Roma at a European scale. It looks at their struggle for living between enforced settlements - like "*nomad* camps" and "refugee camps" - illegal shantytown and dispersed shacks, from where they are often evicted by force.

By designing a competition program, the goal is to elaborate an urban, architectural and social design strategy looking for possible ecological, cooperative, alternative housing solutions and their integration in the urban context.

Awareness about the geopolitical issue of Roma discrimination in Europe will be at the origin of the design research. It will focus on questions of settlement of Roma from ex Yugoslavia in Italy and Serbia in correlation to the legal, social and cultural aspects of their rights to leave, return, and most of all, stay.

Starting from the comparison between the so-called "Balkan" and "Western" models (Piasere 2004), it will explore the problem of dwelling for Roma people today in Rome and Belgrade.

### **Rome:**

Rome is the place where in the last 20 year the highly criticized Italian model of the "*nomad* camp" has been built. It is also a city facing an emergency of about 15000 people (including Roma, non Roma immigrants, refugees, displaced people and homeless) living in *popping up* shantytowns along the banks of the Tiber and Aniene rivers. The municipality has started to forcibly evict the settlements. It is also now pondering an enforced hyper-concentration of these people in four "solidarity" camps to be constructed along the highway belt of the city, as proposed last summer by the " Security Pact" signed by the Ministry of Interior Affairs, the Major of Rome and the Head of Police Department.

### **Belgrade**

The United Nations Human Settlements Program (UN Habitat office) in Belgrade – together with international organizations and national institutions - is currently involved in the question of resettling both Roma refugees repatriated from EU and internal refugees

The access of Serbia in EU in 2015 is in fact tied to the repatriation of 100.000 Roma refugees from European countries. This will imply that the majority of Roma population will become part of the European Union. This is a question that urgently needs to be addressed in order to avoid the problems that the access to the EU of Romania is currently creating.

**Collaborations:**

The program will run parallel courses in the Faculties of Architecture of University of Roma Tre, University of Belgrade (Master project studio) and KTH Stockholm. The courses will address the issue of Settlement and Inclusion of Roma communities in the context of contemporary Europe, developing alternative and complementary urban and architectural strategies and instruments. The exchange of experiences and practices will be continually realized both online and through visits and travels of students and professors, which will be documented so as to allow a wide dissemination among all the involved partners. The parallel programs will be coordinated but developed autonomously, ensuring moments for exchange and comparison of experiences.

**Program:**

Students from TU Delft will work on a specific site in Rome, a "Campo Nomadi" inhabited by Roma people originally from Serbia, which has been temporally accepted, but not equipped by the public administration. Three generations of immigrants live here, dwelling in shacks. Only the eldest generation was born in Serbia and speaks the language, while there are two generations born in Italy and only speaking *Romanes* and Italian.

They also will be visiting Belgrade together with the students from KTH Stockholm and from the Faculty of Architecture of the University of Belgrade (engaged in a parallel Master Course on Innovative solutions for the urban and environmental organization and inclusion of Roma settlements and communities in the outskirts of Belgrade). They will exchange experiences through workshop sessions, and meet representatives of international organizations (such as UN-Habitat), national institutions (such as the Agency for Human and Minority Rights and the Secretariat for the implementation of the Roma National Strategy), and local NGOs (such as the Society for Improvement of Local Roma Communities). They will also visit the Roma settlement where UN-Habitat participated community upgrading projects are implemented and also visit the villages where Roma people now living in Rome are originally from.

**Goals:**

The students will be asked to design a common strategy of intervention on the two sites in Rome (Delft and Rome students) and Belgrade (Belgrade and Stockholm students), by conceiving an **international competition program** for each site, which includes **a map of the geopolitical question of European Roma**, an **urban design proposal** and a **methodological approach on participation, materials re-use, economic and ecologic sustainability**.

The program will take place in Delft, Rome and Belgrade. The project will lead to an exhibition to be held in Delft, Rome and Belgrade.

**Schedule:****Delft****Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> 2008**

The students will be part of the general Urban Body program.

The specific contribution of the Rome - Belgrade program will be:

**- Program presentation to students and first seminar.**

Ivan Kucina, (Ass. Prof. at the Faculty of Architecture of Belgrade University and director of the master program of the Department of Architecture Design on Innovative Solutions for the Urban and Environmental Organization and Inclusion of Roma Settlements and Communities in the Outskirts of Belgrade), and Barbara Galassi (architect and planner of the UN-Habitat Program in Serbia), will be visiting Delft for a first exchange and presentation of experiences from the Balkan region.

Presentation of the project "The beds of the River" by **Stalker - ON** in collaboration with the students of Architecture, Roma Tre University. For six months the Tiber riverbanks have been explored encountering and mapping all the informal settlements.

#### The goal

The right to inhabit of Roma in Rome  
From refusing "Campo Nomadi", enforced evictions and discrimination policies to an housing path for Roma in Rome.

#### The strategy

The workshop will require living in caravans and moving through different formal and informal Roma settlements: planned "Campi Nomadi" and illegal slums.

Visits, lectures, mapping fieldworks, storytelling, movies and convivial moments will be the keys to access the Roma housing question in Roma.

The strategy will be to focus on different questions, levels of interaction and *reciprocal learning* between students and Roma people.

#### A framework

The program will be part of a wider multilayered framework. UN perspectives on major issues that are strongly influencing the question of Roma housing in Rome will be used as navigators for the project. In particular we will try to investigate the two-sided perception of these questions:

- The EU - Ex Yugoslavia relationship

Integration VS fragmentation

Roma *trans-European* citizenship across borders both as a problem and as a value.

-The Rome - Roma relationship

Inclusion vs segregation, the policy of camps and the emergence of slums in Rome

- The Roma - Gagè relationship

hetero- and self- perception in the reciprocal shaping of identities

-The housing question: architects and inhabitants

between formal and informal, architects and inhabitants, practices and laws, how to create a path between plans & slums. Learning from Roma and back.

#### The tools

Caravans & maps

The first tool to promote the quality of the relationship between students and Roma is the use of caravans as living and mobility system to access Roma settlement. Our guide will be a Roma traveling family (one of the few still existing), which has been recently evicted from a parking lot.

Four layers of Roma spatial and relational world will be the common elements of study; four different scale maps will be given to the students as a tool to trigger the exchange with the Roma we will encounter and work with.

The four maps are:

**Europe.** This map represents relationship system of the different Roma communities in Rome on a European scale. It will allow understading the general question of citizenship for Roma in the frame of the EU - Ex Yugoslavia geopolitical situation. It will also help grasping the diversity of Roma communities and their recent past.

**Rome.** This map of Rome focuses on the neighborhood where Roma people live. It will allow the relational system of a single community to take shape, learning about both their level of integration in the city and the economic dynamics within a community.

**The Settlement.** This map of the settlement focuses on the comprehension of the spatial, family- and community- relationships. This enables to foresee the sustainable division of major constricted camps into smaller community-based settlements. It also allows the study of the relational spatiality of the enlarged family system in smaller settlements, which could be the design base of housing solutions.

**The House.** This map will be designed and studied together with the inhabitants to establish a reciprocal learning process with Roma, focused on both technologies and spatial behaviors in relation to dwelling. This process could produce housing solutions to be used later to face the wider housing emergency in Rome.

### **Flights**

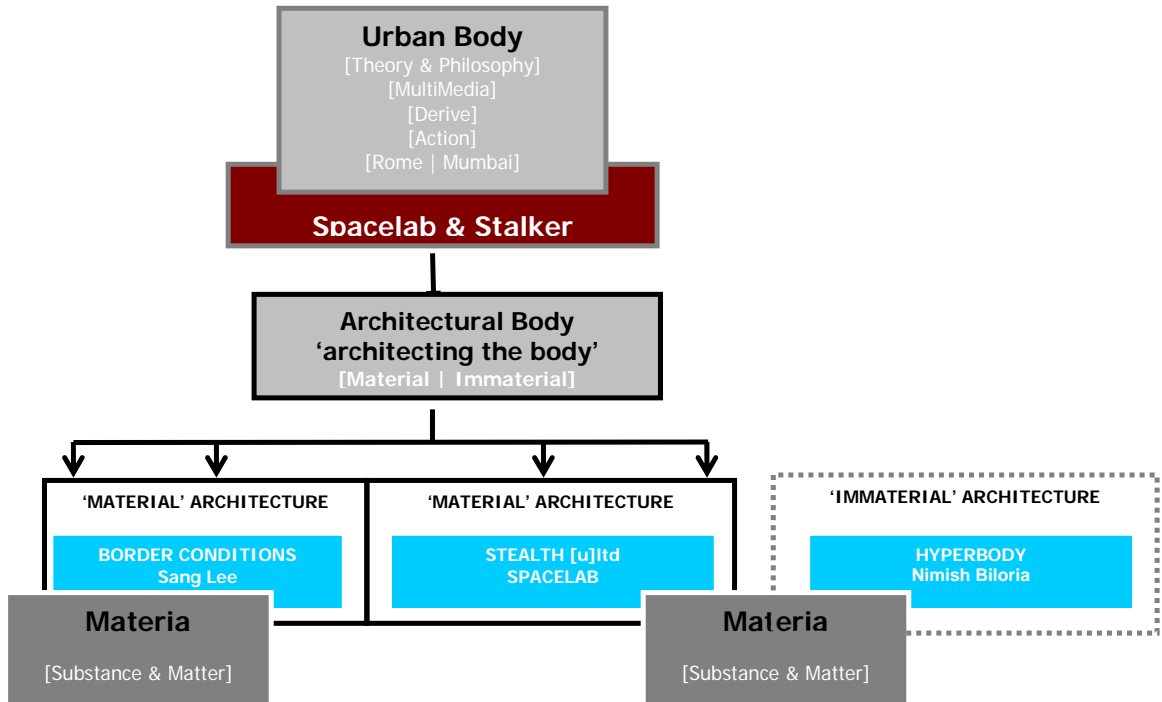

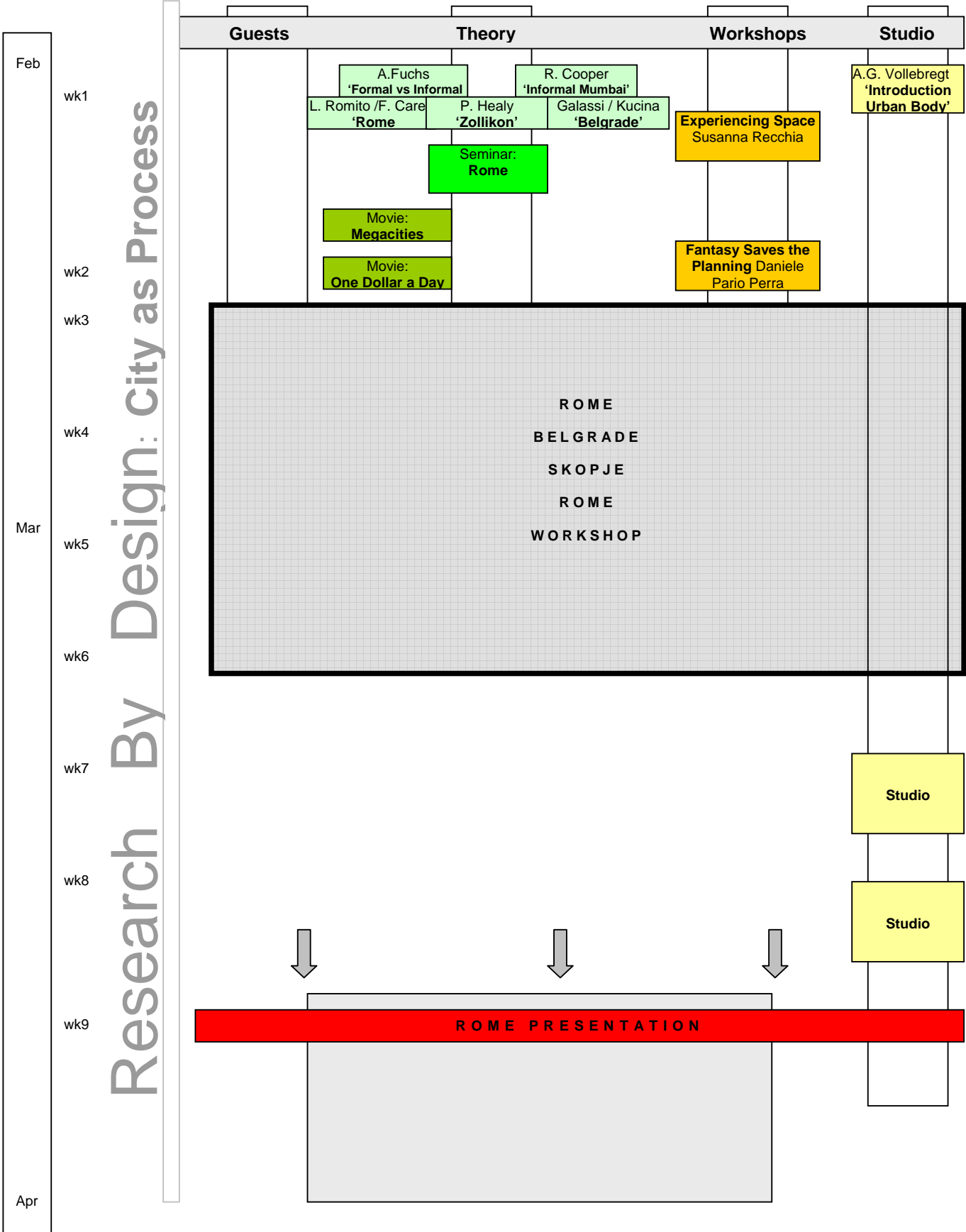

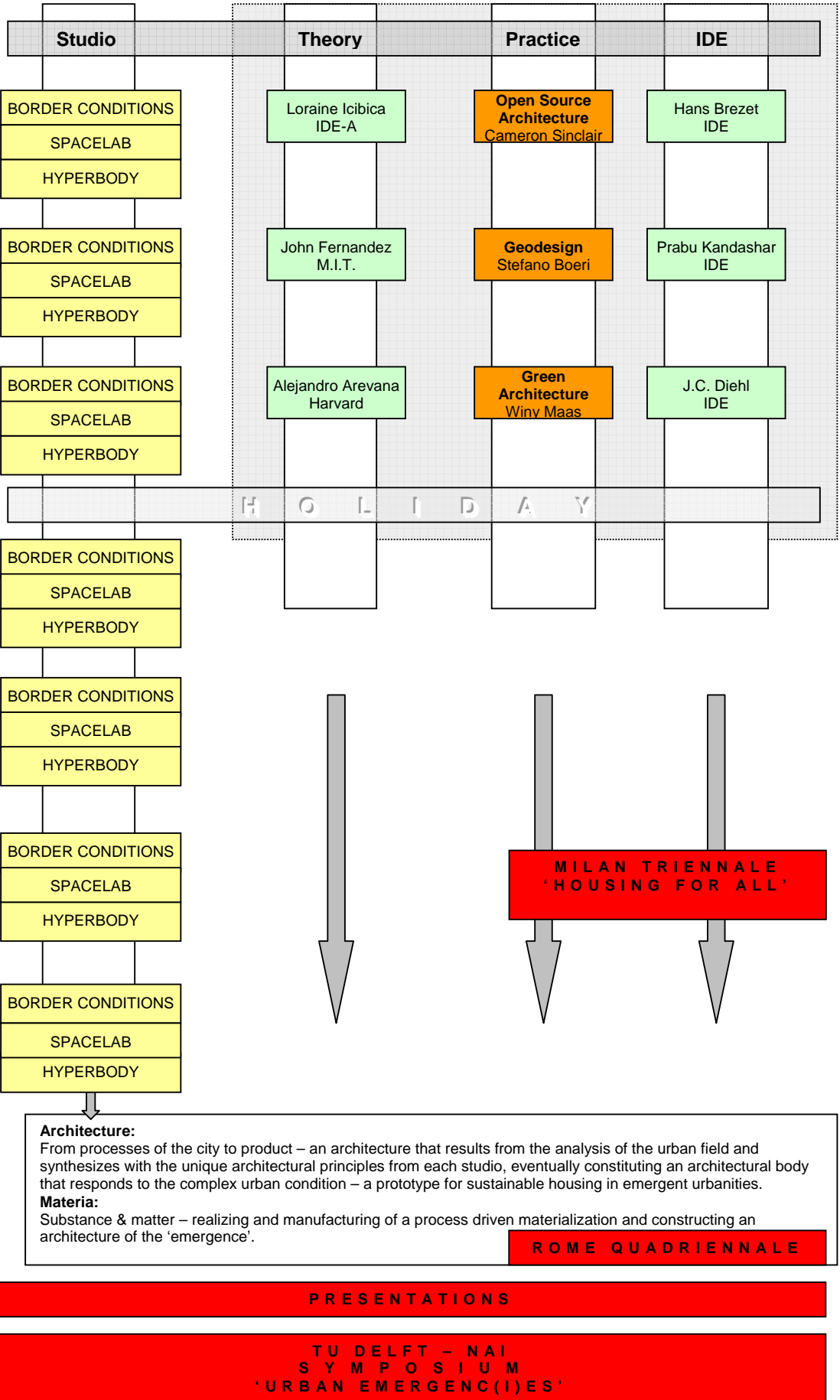
